### IN MY OPINION

Hi,

Just read your newsletter and the article regarding Antifouling comparison (As a Matter of Interest, December 2016 newsletter).

Now I don't want to discredit the work these guys have done but this test is incorrect and flawed.

My background is Thirty plus years in the marine Coatings industry, developing, applying and testing antifoulings for one of the world's biggest manufacturers.

When testing Antifoulings on a boat you have to apply the AFs so they are being compared evenly.

They have to be applied to be in the same water temp, water flow velocities, UV exposure, water salinity, contamination...etc.

A boat facing east/west in a high tidal area, with a fresh/salt mix, and a finger jetty on the south side will have huge variances between the top 200mm and the keel, as well as port and starboard. Summer will be totally different to the cooler water temp, more fresh, less UV of winter.

Having one AF applied along the boat in the "warmer water, higher water movement, high wear/ contamination and higher UV exposure area" and one below it in a cooler, slower water movement, less UV... will not produce any comparison data worth considering.

The best way is to either do panels facing the same direction and in the same depth or apply AFs across the boat from the waterline on one side to the other in a wide strip format.

This allows the AFs to be equally compared at each depth/side (for differences stated above) and allows for the vessels position (which way it is facing in the berth) and how water flows, sun, contamination, etc effect both sides of the boat.

Also the correct applied film (recommended Dry film thickness in microns) of AF has to applied in order to get a true comparison. Just slapping two coats of each on is not accurate enough.

Sorry to burst the bubble but this test will reveal nothing.

### **CENTREBOARD REPORT**

December and January have been busy months for the centreboard section of the club. The regatta on the 17<sup>th</sup>. to 19<sup>th</sup>. December, organised by Kerikeri youth sail group in conjunction with the Club was blessed with good weather and the five teams involved had some great racing.

From the 9<sup>th</sup>. to the 13<sup>th</sup>. of January Aevril was in charge of running our first holiday fun sail of the year. The course was fully booked with more than 20 sailors each day. KCC junior sailing courses are quite unusual in 2 main ways, we have a range of at least 9 classes for sailors to try out on and we have our 2 senior Flag Officers with enough enthusiasm and dedication to commit time from more elevated activities to come along and motivate young sailors to enjoy the sport. Ray Hasler current Chair of YNZ Board also donates lots of time and expertise to our young sailors, quite unusual more than welcomed! The club has run a January holiday course for many years but this year we trialled a second course, from the 23<sup>rd</sup>. to 27<sup>th</sup>. Thanks to Aevril's energy and enthusiasm, this was also well attended and very successful in spite of some very challenging winds.

The second half of our season has started with the School squad coached by Reuben training for three weekends in a row in a determined effort to get our new sailors up to speed for the Regional regatta in March. We have enough sailors for at least two full teams, again Kerikeri is unusual in this respect most areas struggle to have much more than one. Co-operation between Club and school is important for this.

For practical reasons our learn to sail programmes are to some extent linked with the School terms. From Saturday 11<sup>th</sup>. February we start our YNZ Learn to sail level I at the Lake. This has become so popular, (booked up) that we are running our level II on Sundays with quite a good number [11] at this level. Both these courses depend on strong support from volunteers who are much appreciated. The courses are family based with parents and grandparents involved on shore and on the water as sailors, helpers and coaches, all are important. Apart from these moderately formal training courses we have Monday afternoon sailing (at the lake) and Thursday afternoon sailing at Dove's Bay. Both are more flexible in their activities and open to all ages. The Thursday afternoons also use a wide variety of classes, Mistrals, Splashes, Bics, Optimists, even some "P"s Sailors are encouraged to bring their own boats and even leave them at the grass corner for convenience. We hope to add Starlings to the fleet. There are 16 at Waitangi with one of our families sailing three between parents and children.

The Harken regatta is open for youth entries, contact Tony for details.

Thanks in part to our courses there are more new members than ever joining in. We even have a generous sponsorship from the Waipapa Rotary Club (much appreciated to help support new members).

Looking forward to a busy Autumn.
