Sailing Instructions

Open to members from any club

1 Rules

- 1.1 This race will be governed by the "Rules" as defined in the Racing Rules of Sailing 2021–2024 (RRS).
- 1.2 The Yachting New Zealand Safety Regulations Part II, Category 5 shall apply to keel yachts and multihulls.
- 1.3 The Yachting New Zealand Safety Regulations Part V, Category C shall apply for trailer yachts.
- 1.4 The Yachting New Zealand Safety Regulations Part VI, Category B shall apply for sport boats and sport trailer yachts.
- 1.5 All other yachts shall comply with their appropriate class and safety rules.
- 1.6 It is compulsory that every boat have on board a functioning VHF radio plus two red and two orange flares (all less than three years old), all of which are readily accessible.
- 1.7 The required safety gear must be carried on board at all times and may be inspected for compliance with these Sailing Instructions.
- 1.8 RRS 51 *Moveable Ballast* is modified to allow boats with moveable/variable ballast systems and/or canting keels to compete. Boats shall comply with ISAF Special Regulations Appendix K and YNZ Safety Regulations 6.1(k) and 6.2(k).
- 1.9 RRS Rule 52 *Manual Power* shall not apply.
- 1.10 Between Sunset and Sunrise the "International Regulations for Preventing Collisions at Sea" will apply, replacing the relevant rules of RRS Part 2 When Boats Meet.
- 1.11 A boat shall not discharge trash into the water.
- 1.12 A boat's crew shall consist of no more than one person wile racing.
- 1.13 The use of self steering devices is permissible.
- 1.14 In exceptional circumstances, and by prior agreement with the Committee, an additional crew member may be aboard for the reasons of safety. The crew member must remain in a neutral position during racing, and not take an active part in sailing the boat. Where this crew member is required to preform tasks that contribute to the running of the boat after the warning signal and prior to the finish, the boat shall score DNF.
- 1.15 While racing and preparing to race (from the 5min preparatory signal until the finish), vessels racing and preparing to race shall not be required to comply with BOI Marine Mammal sanctuary requirements. These requirements must be complied with at all other times:
 - 1.15.1 Vessels coming within 300m of a marine mammal must come to a stop
 - 1.15.2 Vessels must travel and no more than 5 knots through marine mammal safe zones
 - 1.15.3 If a vessel sees a marine mammal while racing, when possible, notification must be given to other vessels racing on VHF Channell 77. Also, the sighting must be reported to the officer of the day. Forms available in the start box.
 - 1.15.4 All sighting must be reported to DOC via DOC website

2 Notices to Competitors

2.1 Notices to competitors will be posted on the Race Notice Board in the Kerikeri Cruising Club and on the club's website at www.kerikericruisingclub.org.nz.

3 Changes to Sailing Instructions

Any change to the Sailing Instructions will be posted on the Race Notice Board and web site more than three hours before any scheduled race on the day that it will take effect, except that any change to the schedule of races which will be posted on the club's Race Notice Board and web site not less than four days before it will take effect.

4 Signals Made Ashore

- 4.1 Signals made ashore will be displayed at the Kerikeri Cruising Club's Start Box.
- 4.2 The AP flag will be substituted by a red light followed by two sound signals. This changes RRS 27.3 *Other Race Committee Actions Before The Starting Signal.*

5 Race Schedule

6 Fleet Board

- 6.1 This is a single fleet event.
- 6.2 The Fleet Board colour is red.
- 6.3 A minimum of two (2) yachts must enter and start to constitute a race.

7 Courses

- 7.1 The course sheets will be made available in the Kerikeri Cruising Club's start box and on the web site.
- 7.2 Course numbers will be displayed no later than the race warning signal.
- 7.3 **Shortened Course:** A race may be shortened at the outer distance buoy. A red light will show along with the appropriate class flag accompanied by two sound signals before the leading yacht reaches the outer distance buoy. This changes RRS Rule 32.2 *Shortening Or Abandoning After The Start*.
- 7.4 When Brothers does not conform to RRS Rule 28.2(b) Sailing the Course it is to be considered a fairway mark
- 7.4.1 Where an automated start system is used, and the Race Committee is not present in the startbox during the race, the OD may shorten the course at the outer distance mark by calling on VHF Channel 77.

8 Areas that are Obstructions: Fairway Marks

- 8.1 Boats while racing will pass on the main navigation channel side of all mooring buoys and moored boats. These areas shall be treated as an obstruction.
- 8.2 Unless any of the following are nominated as rounding marks, yachts when racing shall pass:

North of the Cocked Hat Island Beacon.

To seaward of the Black Rocks.

North of Flat Island.

South of all of the Te Pahi Islands including Motuterakihi.

To seaward of Brampton Buoy.

North of all rocks off Tapeka Point.

South of Reidy's Buoy.

9 The Start

9.1 Races will start as follows: This changes RRS Rule 26 Starting Races.

5 minutes prior to start
4 minutes prior to start
1 minute prior to start
Start

Amber light & horn
Green light & horn
Green light off & horn
Amber light off & horn9.1

- 9.2 Unless otherwise specified, the Kerikeri Cruising Club's **start line** is a transit through the pole behind the western end of the clubhouse and the white pole immediately south of the Clubhouse. The length of the **start line** is defined by inner and outer distance marks which may or may not be on the transit.
- 9.3 A yacht starting later than 15 minutes after the starting signal will be scored Did Not Start without a hearting.

- This changes RRS A4 Low Point System.
- 9.4 An **Individual Recall** will be notified by displaying one **Red** light following the starting signal along with **one** sound signal. This changes RRS Rule 29.1 *Individual Recall*. The Race Committee will attempt to broadcast identified names and/or sail numbers on VHF channel 77. Failure to make a broadcast or to time it accurately will not be grounds for a Request for Redress. This changes RRS 62.1(a) *Redress*.
- 9.5 A **General Recall** will be notified by one **Amber** light and one **Green** light along with **two** sound signals. The recall lights will be removed along with **one** sound signal. This changes RRS Rule 29.2 *General Recall*. The warning signal for the restart shall be made **one** minute following the removal of the General Recall lights.
- 9.6 An **Automated Start System** may be used. This does not alter instruction 9.1 above, however the start box will not be attended at start time by the race committee. Each yacht is required to carry a timepiece synchronised with the automated start system clock.
- 9.7 Where the start box is unattended, 9.4 and 9.5 shall be deleted.

10 Alternative Starts

In the event of a power failure or a breakdown in the automatic starting system RRS Rule 26 *Starting Races* shall apply.

11 The Finish

- 11.1 The **finish line** shall be between the inner and outer distance marks. If the outer distance mark is missing the finish line shall be the transit through the pole behind the western end of the clubhouse and the white pole immediately south of the Clubhouse.
- 11.2 If the Race Committee is absent when a boat finishes, she should report her finishing time and her position in relation to nearby boats to the Race Committee at the first reasonable opportunity.
- 11.3 Where an automated starting system is used, and the race committee is on present in the start box during the race, the finishing time must be taken on a timepiece synchronised to the time on the automated start system
- 11.4 Where an automated starting system is used, a yacht's finish time must be reported to the race committee on the entry form in the start box no later than 45 minutes after the last yacht has finished in the format HH:MM:SS

12 Time Limit

- 12.1 The time limit for any boat to finish is 4 hours following the start of the race.
- 12.2 Boats failing to finish within the time limit will be scored DNF without a hearing. This changes RRS 35 *Time Limit and Scores,* RRS A4 *Low Point System* and RRS A5 *Scores Determined By The Race Committee.*

13 Re-run of races

The race organisers reserve the right to rerun any postponed or abandoned races. Any rescheduling will be notified on the Kerikeri Cruising Club's website and on the club's race notice board not less than four days before it will take effect.

14 Penalty System

- 14.1 RRS Rule 44.1 Taking a Penalty is changed so that the Two-Turns Penalty is replaced by the One-Turn Penalty.
- 14.2 A boat that has taken a penalty or retired under rule *31Touching a Mark* or rule 44.1 *Taking a Penalty* shall complete an acknowledgement form at the race office within the protest time limit.
- 14.3 RRS Rule 44.1 *Taking a Penalty* is changed to permit a boat that has broken a rule of Part 2 *When Boats Meet* or RRS Rule 31 *Touching a Mark* to take a penalty after racing but prior to any protest hearing. Her penalty shall be a scoring penalty as calculated in RRS Rule 44.3(c) *Scoring Penalty* equal to 40% of the number of entries in her fleet or 50% of the difference between her finishing position and the number of entries in her fleet, whichever is less.

15 Protests and Requests for Redress

- 15.1 Protest forms are available from the Race Office. Protests and Requests for Redress shall be delivered there within the time limit along with a \$10 protest fee.
- 15.2 The protest time limit is 60 minutes after the last boat has finished the race. The same protest time limit applies to all protests by the Race Committee. This changes RRS 60.1(a) *Right to Protest; Right to Request Redress* or RRS Rule 69 *Action by a Protest Committee*.

- 15.3 In addition to RRS 61.1 *Informing the Protestee*, a boat intending to protest shall verbally notify the Race Committee on VHF channel 77 and receive an acknowledgement after finishing the race and before leaving the race area
- 15.4 For any protest where only a rule of RRS Part 2 *When Boats Meet* is alleged to have been broken, an arbitration hearing will be offered as per YNZ regulations part 4.5.5 *Arbitration*.
- 15.5 Notices will be posted within 30 minutes of the protest time limit to inform competitors of hearings in which they are parties or named as witnesses. Hearings will be held as soon as practicable.
- 15.6 Notices of protests by the Race Committee or Protest Committee will be posted to inform boats under RRS Rule 61.1 (b) *Informing the Protestee*.

16 Safety Regulations

A yacht that retires from a race shall notify the Race Committee as soon as possible by either VHF Channel 77 or to the Race Office on telephone (09) 407 9434.

17 Official Boats

Official boats will be marked with a J Flag.

18 Radio Communication

- 18.1 Except in an emergency, a boat shall neither make radio transmissions while racing nor receive radio communications not available to all boats. This restriction also applies to mobile telephones.
- 18.2 The working channel for the race will be VHF channel 77.
- 18.3 The OD may communicate to the fleet via channel 77 for the purposes of shortening the course, or provide other information in relation to the running of the race.

19 Prize Giving

For this race, due to shortage of committee members prize giving will not be held after the race. Ensure completed times are recorded on the on the entry form in the start box in the format HH:MM:SS Final results will be posted on the Kerikeri website race results during the following week.

20 Disclaimer of Liability

Competitors participate in all races in this series entirely at their own risk. Refer to RRS Rule 4 *Decision to Race*. The Kerikeri Cruising Club will not accept any liability for material damage, personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or following this race.
